If you're not in the United States, feel free to leave the USDA Hardiness Zone menu blank, and simply set your Average Last/First Frost Dates below. Alternatively, you might select a USDA Hardiness Zone that corresponds to your geographic location instead- for example, if you're in southern Canada, the northern US zone might work for you.

If you farm in a warm weather climate where frost does not occur, you can select "No Frost" to ignore seasonal weather and create the plantings at any time of year.
